Leigh Waxman and Chana Schwartz of Oakwood Avenue came into to report that when cars are parked on both sides of the street it is very difficult to travel down the block, It is too narrow, not safe. They Mayor will have a questionnaire hand delivered to all residents on Oakwood Avenue to ask them if they are in favor of having no parking on one side of the block and parking on the East side of the block.

Irene Khane of Livingston Place reported that 320 Livingston Place was sold to a Yeshiva for Boys and that it appears that they use it for a dorm.
