Village Clerk-Treasurer Plaut took roll call, everyone present.

On motion of Trustee Brown, seconded by Trustee Zisman, the following reports for the month of October 2025 were unanimously accepted:

On motion of Trustee Plaut, seconded by Trustee Wasser, payment was approved of all properly audited vouchers, except as noted as per the Board Audit dated November 3, 2025, covering vouchers from October 28, 2025, through November 3, 2025.

On motion of Trustee Zisman, seconded by Trustee Wasser, the Board Meeting Minutes of October 27, 2025, were adopted.

On motion of Trustee Brown, seconded by Trustee Zisman a resolution was adopted to update Parking Permit Fees for Business and Non-Resident Permits. Business Permits will increase to \$370.00, and Non-Resident Permits will increase to \$480.00.

Michael Herzog of 291 Cedarhurst Avenue and Lenny Bobrow of 257 Cedarhurst Avenue addressed the Board regarding the growing dangers related to e-bikes and electric scooters. They would like the Village to help get the word out that e-bikes and electric scooters are illegal and not permitted in the Village.

Maria Arra of 287 Cedarhurst Avenue, spoke of an incident that occurred in August. Ms. Arra was walking on the sidewalk when she was struck from behind from a young man riding an e-

bike. She sustained injuries and went to the hospital and to this day is still experiencing great pain.

Mayor Weinstock and the Board advised Mr. Herzog, Mr. Bobrow and Ms. Arra that they agree with them on this issue. Operating E-Bikes and electric scooters on sidewalks is illegal in the Village of Cedarhurst, but it is very difficult to enforce. The Village will do whatever is possible to help. Putting signs up, sending flyers and emails were a few of the suggestions.

There being no further business before the Board, on motion of Trustee Plaut, seconded by Wasser, the meeting was duly adjourned.
