Village Clerk-Treasurer Plaut took roll call, all were present.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Brown, seconded by Trustee Zisman, the following reports for the month of May 2026 were unanimously accepted:

On motion of Trustee Wasser, seconded by Trustee Zisman, payment was approved of all properly audited vouchers, except as noted as per the Board Audit dated August 3, 2026, covering vouchers from July 13, 2026, through August 3, 2026.

On motion of Deputy Mayor Brown, seconded by Trustee Plaut, the Board Meeting Minutes of July 13, 2026, were adopted.

On motion of Trustee Zisman, seconded by Deputy Mayor Brown, the Planning Board Meeting Minutes of July 15, 2026, were adopted.

On motion of Trustee Plaut, seconded by Trustee Zisman Resolution No. 2026-22 – Authorizing the appointment of Robert B. Kronenberg, Esq. as Hearing Officer Pursuant to Civil Service Law Article V was adopted.

Ms. Sara Kaplan, 321 Argyle Road, addressed the Board regarding the high number of cars that go speeding up and down Argyle Road. In her opinion the installation of speed bumps would help this problem.

Ms. Roz Liebenthal, 409 Argyle Road, addressed the Board regarding the problem of cars not stopping at stop signs as well as speeding on Argyle Road. Ms. Liebenthal would like speed bumps installed on her block. She also stated that it has become very dangerous with the number

of people walking in the street, especially at night when they are dressed in black. She would like people to be made aware of this danger.

Ms. Liebenthal also complained that the library is no longer offering zoom for programs that they offer. The Board advised Ms. Liebenthal that the Village does not have any control over the library and New York State is looking into a number of issues involving the Library.

Ms. Nirit Jasse, 369 Argyle Road, would like Rabbis to advise their congregants that they should not walk in the street especially at night when they are wearing black. Ms. Jasse also addressed the Board regarding the speeding of cars on Argyle Road and would like speed bumps installed.

Ms. Aliza Rotberg, 441 Argyle Road, addressed the Board regarding the speeding of cars as well as cars not stopping at stop signs. Ms. Rotberg thinks that installing speed bumps will help with these problems.

Ms. Debbie Bienenfeld, 5 Weyant Drive, addressed the Board regarding the long-term parking that is taking place on Weyant Drive. The Board advised Ms. Bienenfeld to contact Village Hall when she sees this taking place, and we will send someone over to take appropriate action.

Ms. Rachelle Wernick, 37 Weyant Drive, addressed the Board regarding a house on Weyant Drive that holds parties which include loud music, smell of weed and loud crowds. These parties go well past 11:00 pm. The Board advised Ms. Wernick that she should call the Nassau County Police when this happens..

Ms. Irene Redlus, 417 Argyle Road, addressed the Board regarding the safety of residents on Argyle Road. She believes that speed bumps should be installed on her block because the speeding of cars on Argyle Road is out of control. Deputy Mayor Brown admonished her for her aggressive and discourteous comments to him and the other Board Members.

Mr. Chaya Harari from Uncle Mochi asked the Board if he would be able to place a sign on the sidewalk in front of his store close to the parking meters. Deputy Mayor Brown advised Mr. Harari that someone may trip over this sign and that the Village Code does not permit signs on the sidewalk, so the Village Board advises against this.

There being no further business before the Board, on motion of Trustee Plaut, seconded by Trustee Wasser, the meeting was duly adjourned.
